

1718: The Alamo is constructed in San Antonio de Bexar


1821: Mexico wins independence from Spain

1835: Sam Houston is named commander of the Texan army.


1836: William Travis and Davy Crockett arrive at the Alamo.

Shoes - Black



Wool Coat – Dark Blue with Red Collar

& Cuffs

Wool Pants - Light Blue

Buttons - Gold

Epaulette - Red

All Leather Straps – White

Shoes - Black

Shako (Hat) – Black with Red & Gold Trim

Musket – Brown Wooden Stock & Silver

Barrel, Lock, etc.

Oval Crossbelt Plate - Gold

Cartridge box - Black

Instructions for minibook

Center:

Do crossword puzzle. Glue in center of book.

On one flap:

Add questions to your puzzle.

For the other flap: (options)

Add ready made timeline.

Add your own timeline/dates.

Add pocket. Color Alamo characters. Cut out characters, glue to mini popsicle sticks for puppets.
